NCJW/LA TO AWARD 11 SCHOLARSHIPS IN JUNE 2015

LOS ANGELES, Calif.--Women Helping Women ~ Community Counseling & Support services (WHW), a program of National Council of Jewish Women/Los Angeles (NCJW/LA), is accepting applications for the spring 2015 cycle of its Scholarship Program.

NCJW/LA scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$2,000 and are awarded to nursing students, teachers, single parents, mid-life women, and film production students. Applications will be accepted until the deadline on May 1, 2015 and 11 scholarships will be awarded in June 2015.

The WHW scholarship program was created in 1987 to distribute funds to both women and men who have made a commitment to higher education as a means of overcoming obstacles in their lives and achieving a better future. Scholarships are awarded to residents of the greater Los Angeles area in two annual cycles according to strict guidelines and a comprehensive application process. Since its inception, the program has provided more than \$342,000 in grants to deserving individuals without regard to their religious or ethnic background. Applications are evaluated based on each student's dedication to their chosen path and their financial need.
