School-Based Programs:

- After School Homework Club: Helping elementary students with homework comprehension and completion
- Art Bridges Culture: Exploring diverse cultures through art in elementary classrooms
- Art Pals: Teaching contemporary art in elementary classrooms
- Light Up a Library: Keeping libraries open and accessible



Community-Based Programs:

- Back 2 School Store: Providing children with the necessities to start the school year

The Talk Project

A peer-to-peer sexual violence awareness program in which high school students conduct workshops at high schools and in youth groups to help prevent sexual violence on high school and college campuses.

Scholarship

A program designed to ease the financial burden of people who are trying to better their lives through education in the aftermath of trauma, loss and other setbacks. Our recipients have ranged from survivors of domestic violence to single fathers to first generation college students.
